Suzi Tetz Weaver is a prophetic Christian author based in Bend, Oregon, whose lifelong passion for writing has evolved into a full-time calling. After a successful 35-year career in vacation ownership sales, she stepped away in December to fully pursue her purpose as a writer and spiritual encourager. Suzi holds a Bachelor of Arts in Speech Communication and Rhetoric from Southern Oregon State University, a foundation that has supported her ability to communicate with clarity, conviction, and heart. Although she has been writing most of her life, her work took on deeper meaning after she gave her life to Christ in 2004, which marked a turning point in both her personal and creative journey.

Her debut book, *Unabashedly Bold*, is a faith-centered, inspirational work designed to empower women to embrace their identity, find their voice, and live with courage and purpose. Structured as a seven-week journey, the book weaves together poetry, scripture, and prayer, making it accessible for individual reflection, partnerships, or group Bible study. Suzi's mission is to reach women from all walks of life—whether they share her faith or are simply seeking encouragement—and inspire them to “take the muzzle off” and step boldly into who they are created to be. In addition to writing, she has served in deliverance and healing ministries, offering spiritual support and guidance to those seeking freedom and restoration.

Today, Suzi lives a life centered around faith, creativity, and intentional living. Her daily rhythm often includes worship music, prayer, and time spent walking her rescue Jack Russell, alongside writing whenever inspiration strikes—day or night. She remains deeply involved in every aspect of her work, from editing and cover design to formatting and outreach, actively connecting with churches and Christian colleges to share her message. With two additional books currently in the editing stage and another set for release soon, Suzi continues to expand her impact, using her voice and her writing to uplift, empower, and encourage women around the world.

Q What do you attribute your success to?

I attribute my success to Abba, my spiritual walk with the Father. That's really the foundation of everything I do. I would also include the encouragement from friends and family as well – they've been such an important support system for me throughout this journey.

Q What's the best career advice you've ever received?

The best career advice I've received is to just use your genuine, transparent, unique gifts in whatever you do. Don't try to be a copycat or anything – just be you to the fullest, and be authentic, transparent and genuine. People can feel that energy. When you walk into a room, especially as women who are caretakers and nurturers and empathetic, you can feel the energy in just a few seconds. So bringing that authentic version of yourself to everything you do is what really matters.

Q What advice would you give to young women entering your industry?

I would say use your words. Have belief in yourself. Know your audience – who you want to reach – and then learn the best way to reach them. Your niche really depends on who you're writing for, so understanding that from the beginning is crucial. Don't be afraid to find your voice and speak up, because that's what this is all about.

Q What are the biggest challenges or opportunities in your field right now?

The biggest challenge I've faced is that publishing a book involves so much more than just writing. It's been a really huge learning curve for me. The books come easy because the words just come to me – they just come whenever they come, and I write them down. But I didn't realize there was so much more to publishing. You don't just put your book out there. I'm learning the marketing side, the promoting side, all of that, and it's been a huge learning curve. Even when I first got it published, I was like, okay, that's cool, now what? And now I'm learning the 'now what' and still going through it. As for opportunities, there are things I haven't really looked into yet, like possibly podcasting. I really just want to get the word out there to as many women as I can, so right now my focus is on getting emails out to churches with my new book trailer to show them how it could benefit other women for Bible studies or group studies.

Q What values are most important to you in your work and personal life?

The values most important to me in both my work and personal life are to always stand up for the truth, no matter who stands with you. I also believe in protecting and helping beings that need your help, whether that be animals or humans – people or beings that might not have a voice, like animals, like children, like the elderly. It's so important to be there for those who can't always speak up for themselves, especially in such a fake world where standing up for truth is more critical than ever.

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
